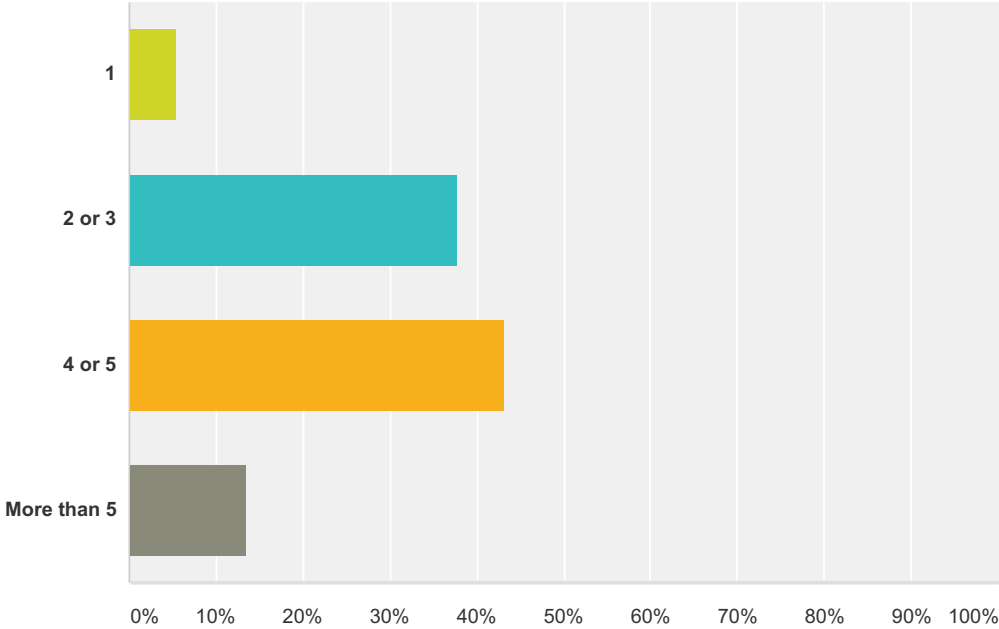

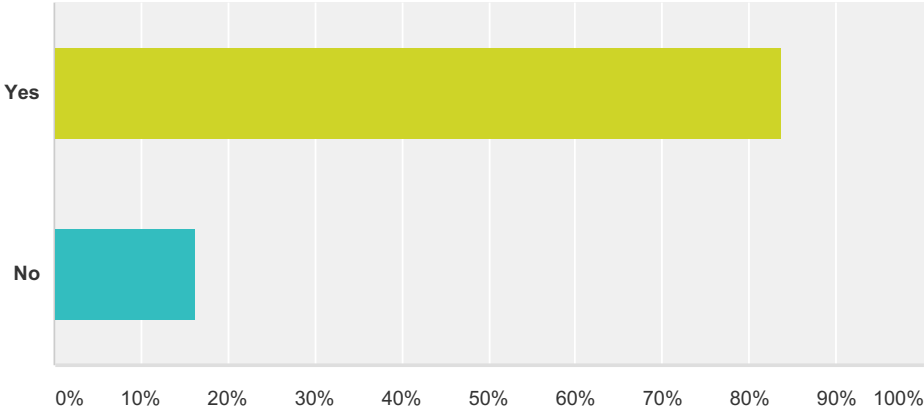

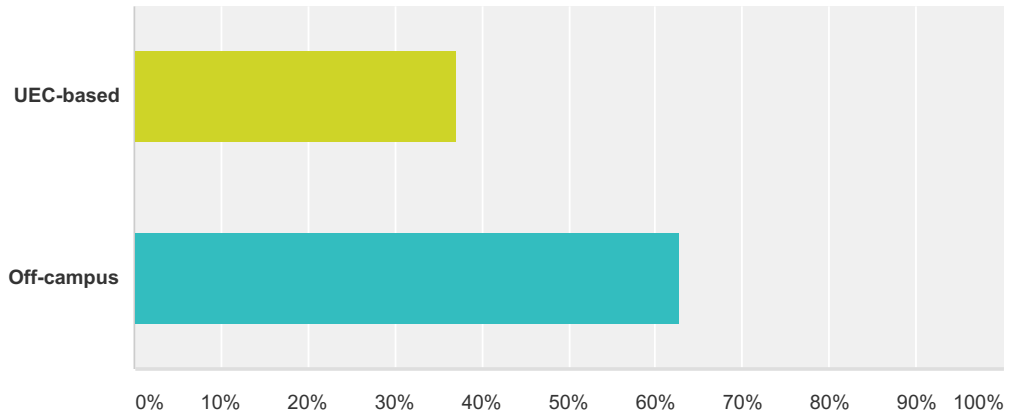

Q4 Are you in a UEC-based residency or one that is primarily off campus?

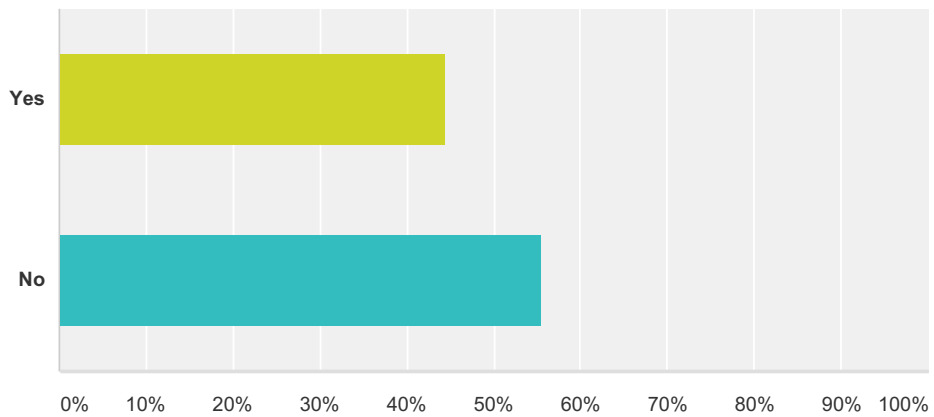

Q5 Did you graduate from SUNY College of Optometry?

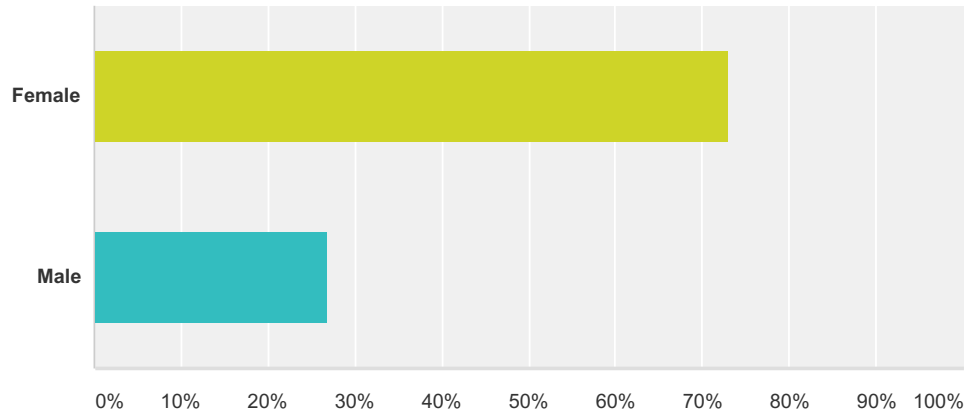

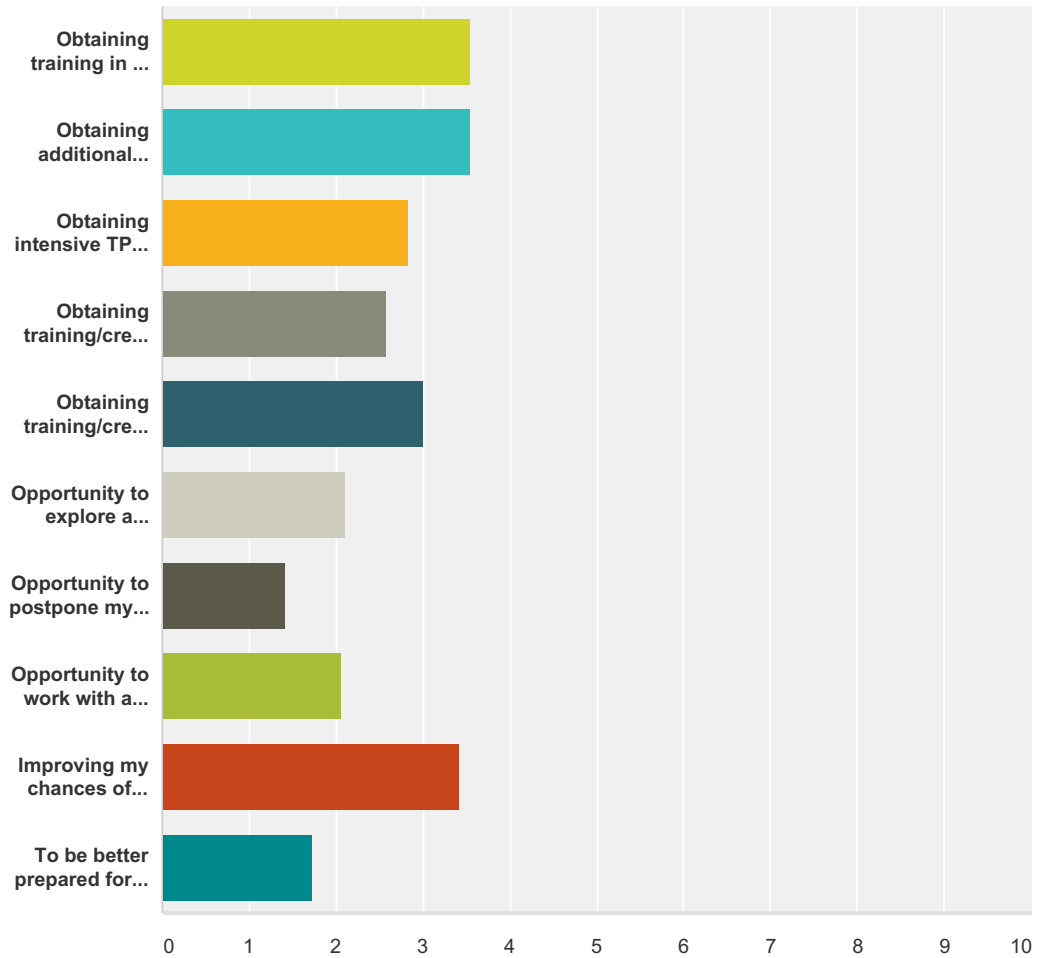

Q9 If you had it to do over again, would you do a residency?

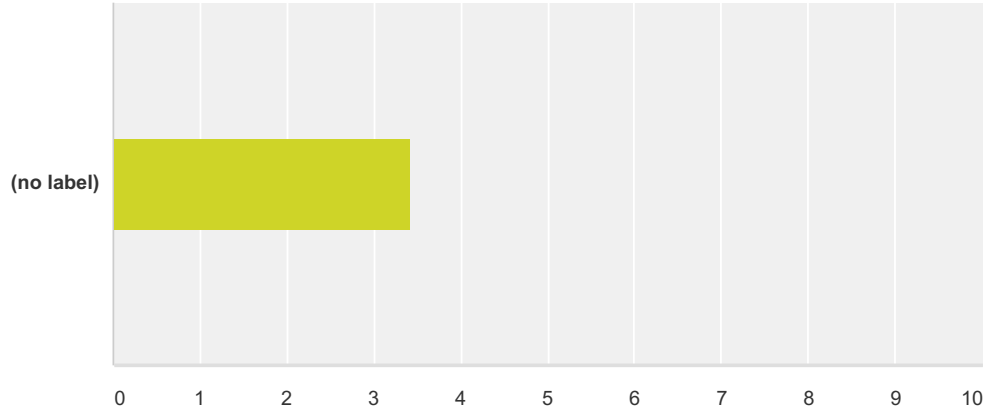

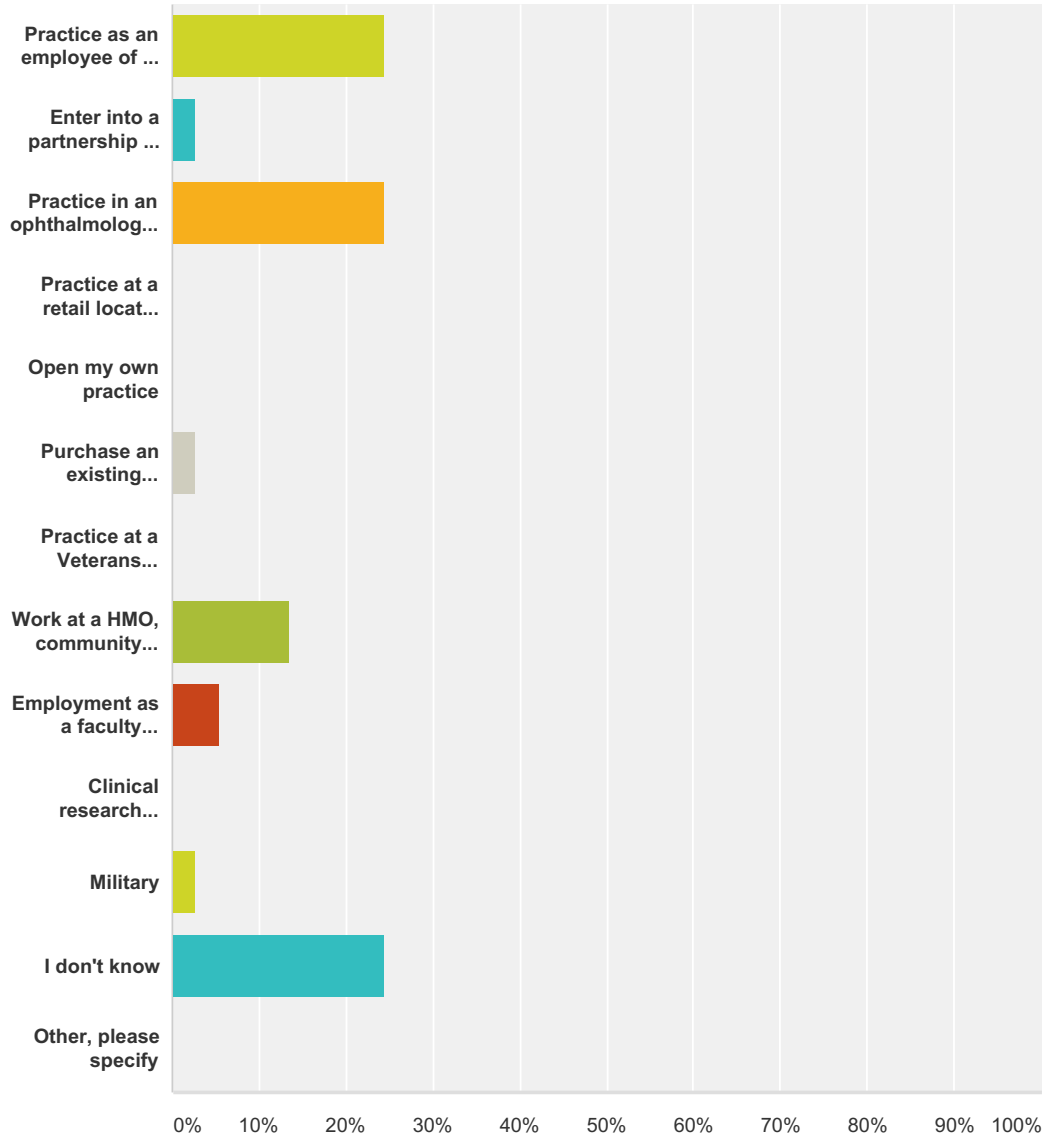

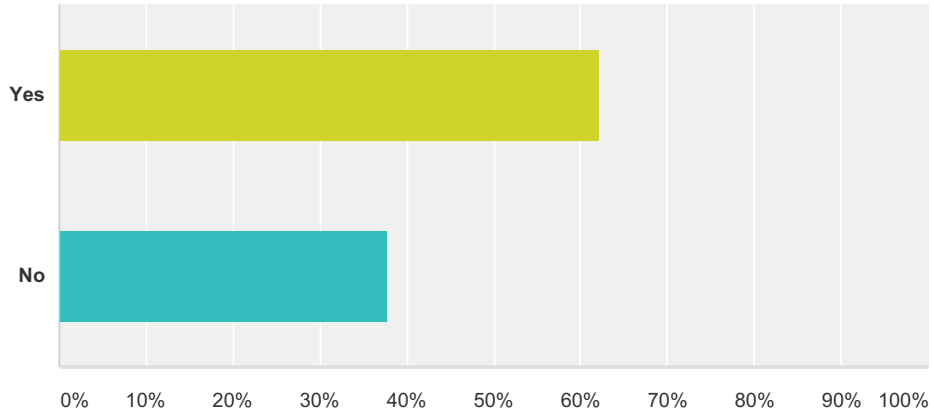

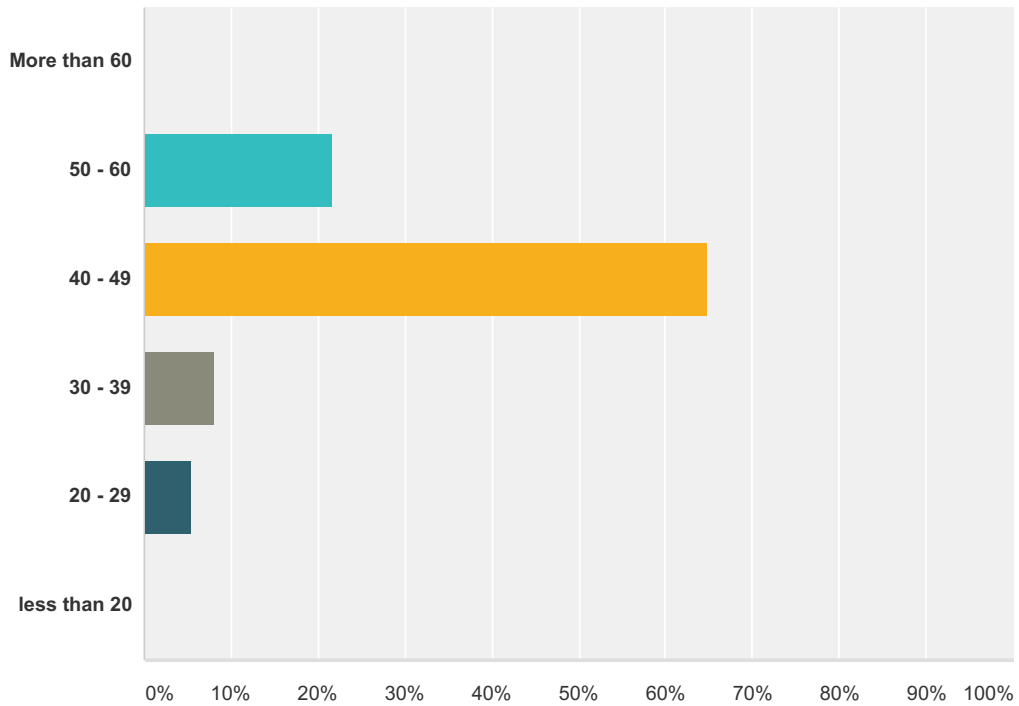

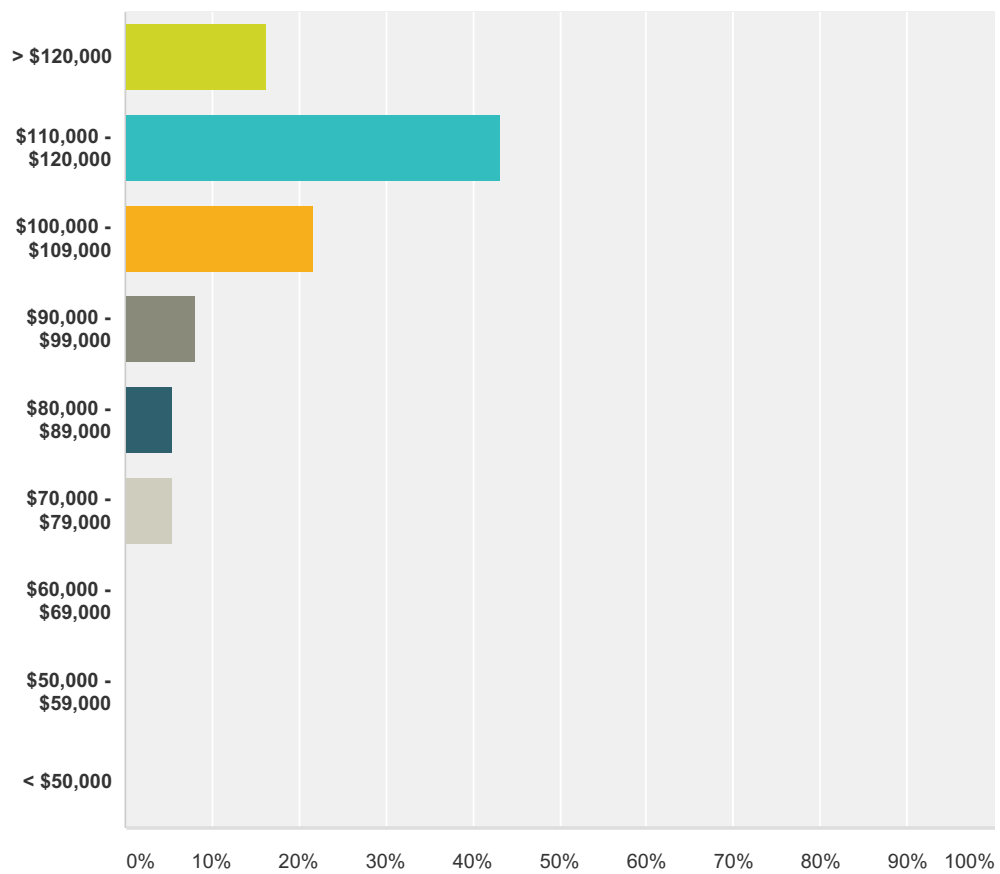

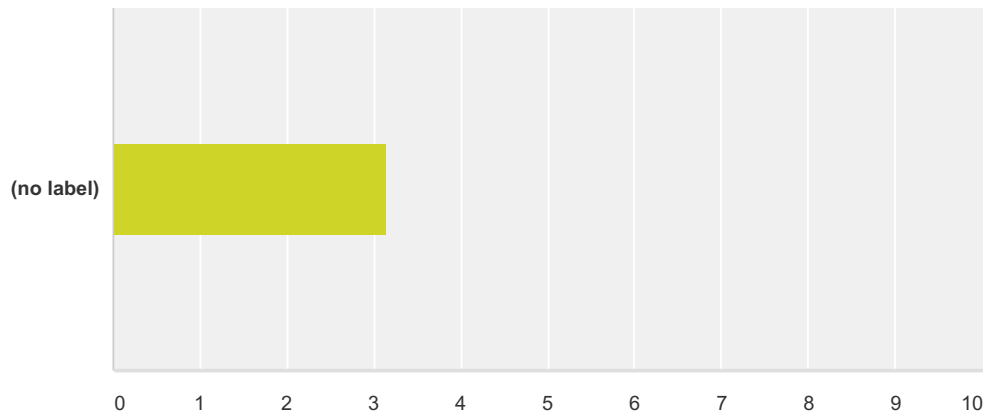

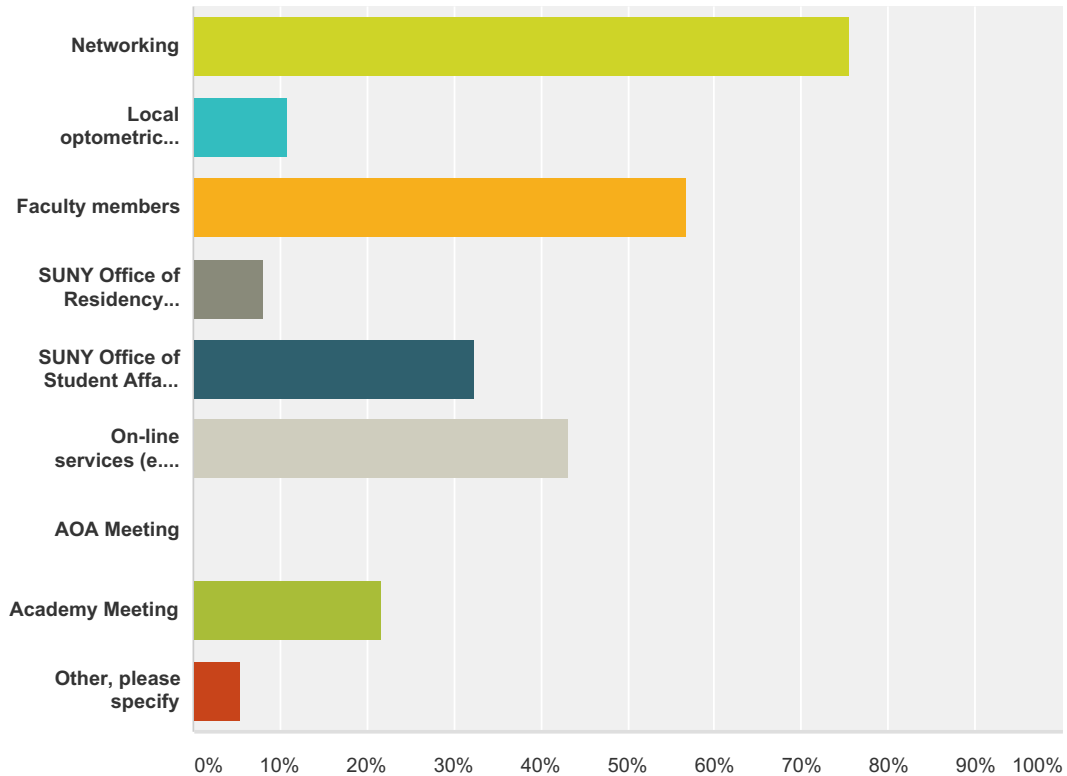
