

Biometry Cornea & IOL Study (B5)

Why we are doing this study:

This study will be evaluating the accuracy and precision of a new investigational imaging device that measures the dimensions of the structures inside the eye in various populations.

Who can be in the study?

You may be eligible to participate if you are 22 years of age or older and have either:

- Healthy eyes
- Cataracts
- History of cataract surgery
- Irregular corneas
- History of refractive surgery

Further screening questions will be asked prior to scheduling an appointment.

What the study involves:

Participants will be screened with assessments typical of an eye examination (including dilation) to verify that the eye(s) meet the requirements to be grouped in one of the categories being studied.

Eligible participants will have one eye scanned by each of the 3 investigational imaging devices as well as by 3 other FDA approved devices.

The entire visit is expected to take up to 4 hours and may be split over 2 visits if necessary.

Will you directly benefit from the study?

There is not expected to be any direct benefit.

Other things you should know about the study:

Participants will be compensated up to \$300.
