

Allysta OASIS-1 Dry Eye Study

Why are we doing this study?

SUNY College of Optometry's Clinical Vision Research Center is conducting a research study to test the safety and efficacy of two different strengths of an investigational eye drop compared to a placebo (eyedrop with no active ingredient) to treat dry eye disease.

Who can be in the study?

Eligibility Criteria:

- Age 18 or older
- History of dry eyes for at least 3 months
- Currently using artificial tears for dry eyes at least 3 times a week for at least 4 weeks
- Current contact lens wearers must be willing to forgo contact lens use 2 weeks before the first visit and for the 14-week duration of the study

Common symptoms of dry eye disease include:

- scratchy sensation or the feeling that something is on the eye
- stinging or burning
- episodes of excess tearing that follow periods of dryness
- discharge
- pain
- sensitivity to light
- redness in the eyes
- heavy eyelids
- blurred vision

Further screening questions will be asked prior to scheduling an appointment.

What the study involves:

This study involves 6 office visits over a 14-week period. You will be asked to use the investigational eye drops twice a day during the duration of the study. Study-related procedures, and investigational eye drops will be provided at no charge to you while you are a part of the study.

Other things you should know about the study:

Study participants will receive compensation up to \$600 for their participation efforts.
