Clinical

The resident will devote approximately 70% of their time to Community Health Optometry and Ocular Disease patient care at the NYC Health + Hospitals/Gotham Health East New York Eye Clinic. Clinical training will be supplemented by the resident devoting approximately 30% of their time at SUNY Optometry/University Eye Center in the Primary Care Service, specialty eye clinics, and teaching in Clinical Optometry Lab.

The resident shall experience at least 1,250 total primary care and specialty encounters. The resident shall manage at least the following minimum number of ocular conditions:
